As a whole, the diocese serves more than 38 major prisons and 17 county jails. Their mission is to serve the men on death row and confinement as well as those who the criminal justice system has determined belong in prison without judging their guilt or innocence, but who wish to practice their faith. These

rides support our incarcerated Christian brothers and sisters that are sometime ignored and shunned by the community.

establishment. He then led us in praying the rosary at the grotto dedicated to Our Lady of Lourdes. After prayer and paying our respects to the church, we rode to the Florida State Prison in Raiford. This is where all 302 Florida inmates on death row are incarcerated. In total, there are about 2,000 inmates at the prison. We were greeted by Mr John Chick, who is the Director of Prison Ministries for the Diocese of St Augustine. He explained the ministry he and others provide to the inmates. He also mentioned they can always use volunteers, including priests, to help serve. Many of the death row inmates are very spiritual and are converted Christians and practicing Catholics. John mentioned these men and women are worshiping and spiritual

a monastic life. We prayed three decades of the rosary for not only the inmates, but all the officers and people supporting the prison. We departed the prison and just a few minutes away arrived at the Union Correctional Institution also in Raiford. Here, we finished praying the rosary and then saddled up and headed for Council 611's picnic at World Golf Village. A wonderful morning riding, praying and having fellowship with my Brothers.

Patriotic Exemplification

The Florida Fourth Degree will continue a cherished Thanksgiving Weekend tradition by holding an Exemplification in Orlando, at the Florida Hotel located in the Florida Mall. The ceremony will begin at noon on Saturday, Nov. 26. The event also includes a banquet following the ceremony; Vigil Mass; Ladies Luncheon; and Patriotic Rosary.

The Florida Mall is located at 1500 Sand Lake Road in Orlando. The Mall includes many stores and restaurants, with free parking. In addition, many of the popular Orlando attractions are only a short drive away.

Registration begins at 9:30 a.m., with the Exemplification beginning at noon. There will be the recitation of the Patriotic Rosary in the anteroom to get candidates into the proper frame of mind for the Patriotic Degree. The Degree will begin at noon.

The event honoree is Robert J. Higgins of Haines City, the State Logistics Coordinator and a member of the Florida Exemplification Team.

There will also be a Ladies Tea at noon.

The Exemplification will be followed by a Vigil Mass at 4 p.m., followed by a banquet at 6 p.m.

The candidate fee is \$70. The fee for a Priest is \$45. The deadline is Wednesday, November 16. Assembly checks are to be made out to: John J. O'Toole, and sent to Master John J. O'Toole, 9686 SW 92 Place Road, Ocala 34481.

Assemblies will be required to send in a downloaded copy of the registration form (please do not write on the original, degree certificate, signed dress code letter, signed Form 4 (all four copies for each candidate) and check by Wednesday, November 16. Forms are available on the Florida State website.

Please note the dress code for the exemplification. While tuxedos are no longer mandatory, candidates must wear a dark suit (not brown!) and black dress shoes. Candidates are encouraged to write the number of their new assembly on the back of their KofC membership card.


